
Get your loom, wind a warp, work on a project. If you don't know what all of this means, join us and we'll show you how we creatively use up our yarn stash. L

Dr. Grandin's research and understanding of animal behavior spearheaded a reform in the quality of life for agricultural animals worldwide. Z



What brought you to Dunlap?

In the fall of 2016, on my oldest son's birthday, we moved to Peoria (a few months later, we closed on our home in Lake of the Woods). We loaded up in a genuine blizzard in Minnesota and made our very slow way here. Some of my favorite stories are about the blizzards in my life! We moved here for multiple reasons:

- More diversity. We liked that the whole world is reflected in the schools of Dunlap. I wanted my sons to grow up and have friends with names that would not be found in our small, rural Minnesota town, pop 350.
- Mark, my husband, was offered a career opportunity that made leaving Minnesota easier. We did not know anyone here.
- House prices. We were able to buy a home that would have easily cost about 40% more in our small resort town.
- The fantastic weather. Yes, I am serious! I grew up and went to college in North Dakota. Mark grew up on a dairy farm in Minnesota and can tell you so many stories about rescuing baby animals in blizzards. He swore when he was a kid that he was moving to Arizona, never to be cold again. Then he married me, who hates the heat. The weather in Illinois is excellent!



Why are you interested in establishing the Friends of Dunlap Public Library?

I can talk about my love of the library for hours, and I'm pleased to be a part of the team establishing the Friends of Dunlap Library as a way to give back to the library. I am surrounded by incredible people in our founding Friends group, and I'm grateful for the support of the leadership team: Brian, who keeps track of our finances; Jessica J, who applies her organizational skills in her role as secretary; Jessica G, our Vice President, who balances my "big picture" skill set with her detailed planning; Celeste, who shares her considerable marketing expertise and ensures that our events are publicized; and Anne, who helps us organize projects and meet deadlines.

What is your favorite way to use our library?

When we first moved here, we didn't know anyone. I was more than a little stunned at the level of loneliness that could occur. I didn't know how to find a good pediatrician, where to get a haircut, or who was a good car mechanic. Do you know where you will find the people who will welcome you and know your name? Dunlap Library. Everyone knows Tina; she and her fellow professionals are the heart of this library and my very first friends in Dunlap. My favorite thing about the library? Tina, Amy, and Melissa. They welcomed me, and they welcomed my sons.

What is something about the library that you want the community to know?

You fit in here. You will be welcomed here. You are the reason for all that we do. There truly is something for everyone here. I hope to see you soon!
