A reminder - The Dunlap Public Library District does not charge fines for late items BUT, if items on your account are not returned or renewed within 10 days of their due date our system will flag them as lost.

When an item is labeled lost in our system your account is charged for the cost of the item (plus \$5.00 in processing fees), thus blocking your account for further checkouts of physical and virtual materials.

As soon as the item is returned all the charges are removed from your account. This process is in place to discourage patrons from checking out items and never returning them.

Items without holds can easily be renewed by using the RSACat Mobile app, signing into "My Account" on our website, or by speaking with the circulation staff.

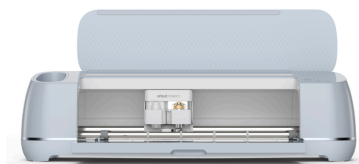
CACTUS

Illinois Libraries Presents: The Many Lives of Kal Penn Tuesday, May 7, 7:00p

Kal Penn discusses his many lives: writer, producer, former White House staff member, starring actor of *Harold and Kumar* and much more! We are thrilled to welcome Kal to close out our 3rd season. Penn is an actor, writer, producer, and former Associate Director of the White House Office of Public Engagement. He is known for starring roles in *Designated Survivor*, *House*, *The Namesake*, the *Harold & Kumar* franchise, and much more. From 2009 to 2011, Penn took a sabbatical from acting to serve as the President's Liaison to Young Americans, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, and the Arts community. He worked on a range of issues, including the repeal of Don't Ask, Don't Tell, the Affordable Care Act, arts and culture programs, and the DREAM Act. In 2012, he was a co-chair for the Obama/Biden re-election campaign and served on the President's Committee for the Arts and Humanities. Originally from New Jersey, Penn has an undergraduate degree in sociology, theater, film, and television from the University of California, Los Angeles, and a graduate certificate in international security from Stanford University. He has taught courses at the University of Pennsylvania and the University of California, Los Angeles. Penn released his first book, *You Can't Be Serious*, in 2021. In 2023, he wrapped production on the climate change docuseries, *Getting Warmer with Kal Penn*, a new comedy, *Surina & Mel*, and has taken two turns behind the desk of *The Daily Show*, following the departure of host Trevor Noah. **Z**
